

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT PROGRAM SUMMARY 2020-2021

Project title	Overview
<b>COLLABORATIVE PROCUREMENT</b>	

<b>Collaborative Procurement</b>	This project will implement collaborative procurement opportunities identified by the Collaborative Resourcing Working Group. It includes finalising the e-waste collection and processing tender which was delayed due to coronavirus. Other potential collaborative procurement opportunities identified include collection and processing of transfer station materials (i.e. mattresses, tyres) and organics processing. Project funds will be used to engage procurement expertise, prepare tender documents, obtain ACCC approvals, and seek legal and probity advice.
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### INFRASTRUCTURE

<b>Closed Landfill Risk Assessment</b>	This project will develop aftercare management policy and plan templates as recommended from Closed Landfill Risk Assessments completed in 2019-2020. These templates will assist councils to prepare their own policy and plans to meet General Environmental Duty requirements under the new Environment Protection Act.
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<b>Optimum Recycling Infrastructure Model</b>	This is the highest priority project listed in the Regional Recycling Action Plan (RRAP). It will explore the optimum waste management infrastructure model for the region. This will consider type of facility/ies, materials, consistency, ownership, vertical integration and control opportunities, location/s, interaction with the kerbside bin system/ service and the Container Deposit Scheme, and current market demand for recycled materials.  It is part funded by RDV and BSWWRRG.
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### EDUCATION

<b>Love Food Hate Waste</b>	This project is the regional delivery of Sustainability Victoria's Love Food Hate Waste campaign to reduce household food waste. Funds will be spent on printing of collateral, social media advertising and events.
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<b>Let's Go FOGO</b>	This project aims to increase diversion of organics through council FOGO bins. It will include regional re-branding the Let's GO FOGO campaign (developed by Moyne, Corangamite and Southern Grampians) and the development of collateral that councils can use for their FOGO education.
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<b>Recycling Education Campaign</b>	This project aims to reduce contaminants in the kerbside recycling bin and increase the diversion of kerbside recyclables from landfill. It includes participation in kerbside trials to understand which interventions work best to reduce soft plastic contamination in kerbside bins. It will also include the development of campaign collateral or regional delivery of SV's campaign (if available).
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<b>Zero Waste Map</b>	This is an online map that lists facilities and resources to assist the community to reduce waste and increase recycling. It will be able to be hosted on councils' and BSWWRRG's websites
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## RESOURCE RECOVERY

<b>Buy Recycled Campaign</b>	This will be a campaign utilising online and print media to encourage households to buy recycled products and showcase the use of recycled products in public projects.
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<b>Project management</b>	This item covers meeting and workshop costs and speakers for the Forum and any expenses relating to the delivery of the program. Project management does not cover wages of BSWWRRG staff.
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
